








Other commissons:



Painted from an on-location study, in San Francisco, as I was on a Plein Air Conference, we painted at several locations. This was my favorite from that trip.




HEAVENLY MOUNTAIN


MARBLE MOUNTAINS

acrylic on canvas 18 x 24 \$540


